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

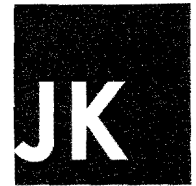

Biography Delaitre Jordan Hollinger

At the age of 22, and a fifth-generation Tallahasseean, Delaitre J. Hollinger is the Founder and Executive Director of the National Association for the Preservation of African-American & Culture, Inc., a non-profit corporation dedicated to the protection of historical properties and preservation advocacy. He is the founding Curator of the Taylor House Museum of Historic Frenchtown with the Tallahassee Urban League, Inc., where he has served since 2011. Delaitre played a key role in having the 121-year-old Taylor House placed on the National Register of Historic Places in 2015.

Currently, Delaitre is a student at Tallahassee Community College, having been active in numerous student organizations and initiatives since he arrived on campus. Advisory Board, and has previously served on the boards of the Frenchtown Outreach Center, Inc., Democratic Club of North Florida, Inc. the Florida A&M University College of Agriculture and Food Sciences Gallery of Distinction and Deans Committee, Florida A&M University College of Arts and Sciences Gallery of Distinction Committee, and the So Unique Enrichment For Girls, Inc. As a TCC student he was formerly a member of the Parking Ticket Appeals, Food Service, Safety/Security,


