

#	Priorities
1	Facilitate the movement of homeless service providers from the Frenchtown community
2	Redevelopment of Shelter and contiguous properties
3	Re-do Economy Drug building into a three-story office plaza. Keep current business at street level. Develop office space on the second floor and a community meeting space on the third floor
4	Green space & landscaping
5	Complete segment three of Cascades Park
6	New infrastructure/community amenities
7	Add amenities to stormwater pond facilities in the area (e.g. park benches, sidewalks, exercise stations, etc.)
8	Redevelopment of City-owned Church's Fried Chicken property next to Elberta Crate stormwater facility as a trailhead for St. Mark's Trail
9	Complete the facilities for Carter-Howell-Strong Park to reflect the initial promises that this park would be like Lake Ella
10	Development of improved infrastructure for Carter-Howell-Strong Park with an emphasis on health and safety
11	Improve Frenchtown infrastructure (water, wastewater, etc.)
12	Support the development of new and revitalized infrastructure in the District

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13	Creation of, or enhancement to, infrastructure that will create both temporary and permanent jobs
14	Develop a Marshall Plan to re-build and upgrade the entire area, block by block
15	Focus on upgrades of Brevard Street to make it more conducive for business activity to occur there
16	The revitalization of retail in the underserved areas
17	Development of a small business support portfolio for community-based businesses
18	Façade improvements to enhance the communities' sense of pride and ownership and ultimately quality of life. Potentially to include increased streetlights, landscaping, and marketing
19	Enhancements to the Tallahassee Senior Center to improve appearance and efficiency of building
20	Grocery store – facilitate the establishment of a grocery store in Frenchtown to address the 'food desert' problem for the community
21	Grocery/food store on Southside, with closer proximity to Gaines Street/Downtown
22	Grocery/food store in Frenchtown
23	Promote a healthy community by establishing a village marketplace to provide access to fresh food in this "food desert"
24	Support the development of locally grown food sales in the district through community based grocery stores/farmer's markets/other healthy food options/etc.

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25	Assist Neighborhood Health Services with rent and/or building them a new building in front of the Renaissance Building
26	Increase neighborhood safety by making Sense of Place improvements designed to increase pedestrian traffic (improved lighting, better sidewalks) along major streets in the area. Improved intersection/roundabout at Macomb, Brevard and Bainbridge
27	Support increased neighborhood safety
28	Add more sidewalks to the district
29	Build lighted bus coverings and seating at all bus stops within the urban core
30	Facilitate transportation by adding a trolley route connecting Frenchtown, Gaines Street, Downtown and Midtown
31	Parking garage at southeast corner of West Tennessee and Bronough is terribly blighted and affects the aesthetics and the safety of the Frenchtown commercial and residential areas across the street to the north
32	Multi-family development on South Monroe
33	Multi-family development in Frenchtown
34	Support arts & entertainment development opportunities
35	Support the creation of locally based attractions that recruit and attract people to the districts (i.e. Frenchtown: Magic Johnson Theater); to include entertainment/cultural and community festivals
36	Emphasize historical significance
37	Adaptive reuse of sites that have ceased to function in their original or intended use
